The books that Griffith, Farran contracted with Hasegawa to produce were

more in the Western vein, with sewn and glued spines, and with Griffith, Farran identification on the cover." - Sharf.

Bloxham subsequently travelled to London to continue her studies before returning to Australia and then travelling to Japan where she taught Tonic Sol-fa with Emily Patton.

Both works resulted in a degree of conflict between the two men, the consequence of Camus' over-exacting standards and expectations and Hasegawa's prolonged process of production. Nevertheless the first title ran to three editions with further editions of the second planned that never materialised. These titles were also published on plain paper in the United States (a substantially inferior edition).

The lucrative business of exporting Japanese plants to European collectors had become far more comitative in the interim, with the Yokohama Nursery Company's handsomely illustrated catalogues proving especially popular. The present work represented Unger's response to these market innovations and proved immensely popular.

The Magdalen Hospital began as Magdalen House which opened in 1758 in Featherstone Street (near present day Old Street station) before moving to 21 Prescot Street, Whitechapel the following year. Prescot Street was then a disreputable area with many brothels, taverns and theatres.

Robert Dingley (1710-81), merchant, architect and philanthropist proposed that a refuge for fallen women who were penitent and prepared to start a new life be founded. The women had to be under 30 years of age and preference was given to the youngest applicants with the least experience of prostitution. The 'patients' were trained in

needlework and laundry work and had to attend religious services twice a day.

The list of subcribers (ie donors) includes Jonas Hanway who gave £30, whilst the single largest donation came from the legacy of Miss Heylyn (£250).

The puzzle resides in the misbound pages, which the reader is invited to solve: "the pages have been printed in a haphazard and incorrect order, a fact reflects little credit on somebody...", and a pink paper leaf informs the reader that "the publisher so grieves for what has happened that he offers two prizes to readers of £25 each who give the full names of the six persons murdered, their murderers, and the correct order of the 100 pages."

The difficulty of the book-length puzzle is attested to the fact that only 2 people solved it at the time. A crowd-funded reprint of the novella was issued after the fiendishly difficult attempt to solve the puzzle went viral online to over nine million viewers. Since the re-print in 2019, only one other person has successfully solved it.
